Chapter 290.

Resolve in favor of the members of the executive committee of the Maine State Agricultural Society.

Whereas, the executive committee of the Maine state agricultural society, in compliance with the requirements of law, have assembled at the state house in Augusta, and have there holden the annual meeting of said committee for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-six, for the transaction of the business legally required of said committee; *and whereas*, it appears that the funds of the Maine state agricultural society and of the several incorporated county societies to which the several members of the said committee belong, are, at the present time, in such condition as not to afford the means of compensating the said committee for their services at said meeting; therefore,

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid to the members of the executive committee of the Maine state agricultural society, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, and for a term not exceeding twelve days, the same per diem pay and mileage as allowed to members of the legislature, according to the pay roll, which shall be made up under the direction of said committee, and which shall be signed by the several members receiving their pay thereon, and filed in the office of the treasurer of state.

Chapter 291.

Resolve in favor of W. R. Webb.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to audit the account of W. R. Webb, for services and expenses incurred in protecting the bridge at Fort Kent, over Fish river, during the freshet in the spring of eighteen hundred and fifty-four, and allow and pay such sum as he may deem just and reasonable; *provided, however*, that the sum so allowed shall not exceed the sum of seventy-five dollars.
