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**CHAP. 292.****Chapter 292.**

Resolve in aid of the road leading from Fairfield's Mills, through township four, range four, west from the east line of the state.

Repair of road from Fairfield's Mills through township No. 4, R. 4, §400. Proviso.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to expend the sum of four hundred dollars, upon the road leading from Fairfield's Mills, through said township; *provided* the settlers cause the sum of one hundred dollars to be expended in like manner with the state.

**Chapter 293.**

Resolve in favor of Joseph Sockabasin.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to Joseph Sockabasin, twenty-five dollars, as a gratuity for his expenses in attending the present session of the legislature.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to Peol Sockis, seventy-five dollars, as a gratuity for his expenses in attending the present session of the legislature.

**Chapter 295.**

Resolve in favor of William W. Quimby.

Pension, \$4 per month.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to William W. Quimby of Bucksport, the sum of four dollars per month, during the pleasure of the legislature.
