Chapter 296.

Снар. 296.

Resolve in favor of Peter S. Folsom.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to Pension. Peter S. Folsom, two dollars per month, commencing January first, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, in addition to the sum now received during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received while in the military service of the state.

Chapter 297.

Resolve authorizing the sale of shares, owned by the state, in the capital stock of the Augusta Bank.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state, if he shall judge sale of shares it expedient, is hereby authorized to sell the one hundred of the Augusta shares, owned by the state, in the capital stock of the Augusta authorized. Bank; provided, however, that such sale shall not be made at Proviso. any price less than eighty-five dollars per share.

Chapter 298.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to sell the lot reserved for the future disposition of the legislature, in plantation number fourteen, east division, in the county of Washington.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby authorized to sell at public or private sale, for such price as shall seem to him reasonable, all the right, title and interest which the state has to the lot reserved for the future disposition of the legislature, in plantation number fourteen, in the east division, in the county of Washington. The net proceeds of the sale, to be paid over to the treasurer of state, for the benefit of public schools in said plantation number fourteen, subject to the pro- Proviso. visions of law regulating the money received from the sales of lands reserved for public uses.
