CHAP. 317.

Return to be
made to
secretary of
state.

said committee are hereby required, on or before the first day of January next, to make a full return of their doings under this resolve to the secretary of the state, to be laid before the next legislature, specifying the time said schools have been kept, and by whom, the average number in attendance, and such other facts as they may deem for the interest of education among said Indians, or which the governor and council may require.

Chapter 317.

Resolve in favor of Abigail O'Brien.

Land agent
authorized to
convey land.

Deed of

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized and directed to convey to Abigail O'Brien of Cornish, in the county of York, two hundred acres of land, not otherwise conveyed, to be selected by the said Abigail's agent, or attorney, within two years from the passage of this resolve, from any settling lands of the state, upon which the timber has been permitted and cut. And said deed of conveyance shall be called for within three months from the time of said selection, or the right herein granted shall be forfeited.

Chapter 318.

Resolve in favor of Simon F. Walker.

Services,

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to Simon F. Walker, ninety-one dollars in full for his services and expenses in executing certain warrants for the arrest of offenders.

Resolve in favor of John N. Goodwin.

Resolved, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorized to audit and settle the claim of John N. Goodwin, for his services as commissioner to examine and classify

the special acts and resolves of the state. And the governor, by advice of council, is authorized to draw his warrant upon the treasurer of the state in favor of said commissioner, for the amount which may be found due to him, from any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Chapter 320.

Resolves authorizing a loan in behalf of the state.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized to procure on the faith of the state, a loan of fifty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum; the principal and interest to be made payable at the city of Boston; and the treasurer is directed to issue bonds therefor in sums not less than one thousand dollars each, with coupons attached for the payment of interest; each bond to be signed by the treasurer, countersigned by the governor, and attested by the secretary of state, with the seal of the state; but the coupons to be signed by the treasurer only. The bonds and coupons to be all dated May first, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

Resolved, That said loan shall be reimbursable, viz: twenty-five thousand dollars in seven years, and the other twenty-five thousand dollars in eight years from said date.

Chapter 321.

Resolve in favor of Charles F. A. Johnston and Charles Kidder.

Resolved, That the land agent be hereby authorized and directed to convey to Charles F. A. Johnston and Charles Kidder, four lots of land, not exceeding one hundred and sixty acres in a lot, in township B, in the first range, in the county of Aroostook, in addition to the two lots granted by resolve approved March fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, in consideration of their having built during the past
