### Chapter 320.

Resolves authorizing a loan in behalf of the state.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized to procure on the faith of the state, a loan of fifty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum; the principal and interest to be made payable at the city of Boston; and the treasurer is directed to issue bonds therefor in sums not less than one thousand dollars each, with coupons attached for the payment of interest; each bond to be signed by the treasurer, countersigned by the governor, and attested by the secretary of state, with the seal of the state; but the coupons to be signed by the treasurer only. The bonds and coupons to be all dated May first, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

*Resolved*, That said loan shall be reimbursable, viz: twenty-five thousand dollars in seven years, and the other twenty-five thousand dollars in eight years from said date.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the state advertise seasonably for proposals for said loan in such newspapers as he shall deem expedient.

### Chapter 321.

Resolve in favor of Charles F. A. Johnston and Charles Kidder.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be hereby authorized and directed to convey to Charles F. A. Johnston and Charles Kidder, four lots of land, not exceeding one hundred and sixty acres in a lot, in township B, in the first range, in the county of Aroostook, in addition to the two lots granted by resolve approved March fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, in consideration of their having built during the past

year, at great expense, a good and substantial saw mill and grist mill, in said township B. *Provided*, the said Johnston and Kidder shall select said lots, and return to the land agent a certificate of such selection, within one year from the approval of this resolve.

**Chapter 323.**

Resolve in favor of Constant A. McLaughlin.

Compensation  
for injuries.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to Constant A. McLaughlin, the sum of two hundred and ten dollars, as a compensation for injuries received in aiding an officer of the peace at Lewiston, on the sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, in capturing one Thomas Hyde, then engaged in a breach of the peace.

**Chapter 323.**

Resolve in favor of Thomas S. Roberts.

*Resolved*, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to Thomas S. Roberts, two hundred acres of land in any township belonging to the state, set apart and lotted for settlement; *provided*, said Roberts shall make the selection and give notice thereof to the land agent within one year from the date of this resolve, the same to be in full for said Roberts' claim under resolves approved July twenty-six, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and April seven, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

Resolve providing for repairing the state road through the town of Baileyville.
