Chapter 330.

CHAP. 330.

Resolve in favor of James Pomeroy.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to James Pomeroy, three dollars per month for injuries received while in the service of the state. Pension.

[Approved March 25, 1856.]

Chapter 331.

Resolve in favor of the Penobscot Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to the agent of the Penobscot Indians, the sum of three hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of said agent, in aid of said Indians in their agricultural pursuits, by purchasing seed and assisting them in planting the same. For purchase of seed, &c.

[Approved March 25, 1856.]

Chapter 332.

Resolve relating to books for the several towns and cities.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the secretary of state to forward to the clerks of the courts of the several counties, all books and public documents belonging to the different cities, towns and plantations in said counties, as soon as may be convenient after the publication of the same. Secretary of state to forward books, &c., to clerks of courts.

[Approved March 25, 1856.]

Chapter 333.

Resolve laying a tax on the counties.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties contained in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax for each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, to wit:

Androscoggin, ten thousand dollars;	Androscoggin.
Aroostook, two thousand nine hundred and fifty dollars;	Aroostook.
Cumberland, thirty-two thousand dollars;	Cumberland.
