### Chapter 334.

Resolve in favor of John Sargent, junior.

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state to John Sargent, junior, the sum of eighty-three dollars and sixty-five cents, for balance due him for services as forage master in the Aroostook expedition, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine; and the governor, with advice of council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer therefor.

### Chapter 335.

Resolve to diminish the state valuation of town of Addison.

*Resolved,* That the state valuation of the town of Addison, in the county of Washington, until the next state valuation, be fixed at one hundred and fifty-six thousand nine hundred and thirty-one dollars, instead of the sum now fixed by law.
