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Chapter 336.

Resolve in favor of Eliza Bartlett.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to Eliza Bartlett, widow of the late William Ellis, junior, the north half of lot numbered thirty-four, in township numbered eleven, in the fifth range of townships, west from the east line of the state.

Chapter 337.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the Indian fund, to the Repairing chaps? agent of the Passamaquoddy Indians, the sum of fifty dollars, point. to be expended under the direction of said agent in repairing the chapel at Pleasant Point, in the town of Perry.

Chapter 338.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Indian fund, belong- Wood and ing to the Passamaquoddy Indians, the sum of fifty dollars annually, to be expended by the agent of said tribe in furnishing wood and fencing materials to such Indians as shall reside at Pleasant point, in the town of Perry.

Chapter 339.

Resolve for the purchase and distribution of the Maine State Register and Business Directory.

Resolved. That the secretary of state be authorized to purchase six hundred copies of the Maine State Register and Business Directory for eighteen hundred and fifty-six, prepared by Edward C. Parks, to supply the several cities, towns and plantations in this state, provided they shall not exceed seventyfive cents per copy. And the governor is authorized to draw his warrant therefor.
