Chapter 349.

Resolve for abatement of state valuation of the town of Arrowsic.

Resolved, That the state valuation of the town of Arrowsic, in the county of Sagadahoc, shall hereafter and until the next state valuation, be fixed at sixty-two thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars, instead of the sum now fixed by law.

Chapter 350.

Resolve in aid of roads in the town of Kingsbery.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to expend in the town of Kingsbery, the sum of two hundred dollars, in repairing the road leading from Kingsbery to Blanchard, south of the mountain.

Chapter 351.

Resolve in relation to the settlement of the account of the land agent.

Resolved, That the allowance to the land agent in the settlement of his account for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-five, by the governor and council, of the sum of nine hundred and forty-five dollars and twenty-five cents, the same being the excess of expenditure upon Mattawamkeag bridge in said year, above the appropriation therefor, is hereby confirmed.

Chapter 352.

Resolve for the payment of the militia called into the public service by order of the governor, June fourth, eighteen hundred and fifty-five.

Resolved, That there be paid to Major General Wendall P. Smith, of the fifth division of the militia of this state, and to the officers, non-commissioned officers and privates under his command, called into the public service by order of the governor, June fourth, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, the following compensation therefor, viz:

Resolved, further, That the adjutant general, as acting paymaster general, be directed to proceed to the city of Portland and make payment to the troops called into public service as mentioned in the preceding resolve, giving due notice to Major General Smith of the time such payment will be made, and he shall make due return of his doings under these resolves, to the governor and council for settlement.

Chapter 353.

Resolve in favor of Volney A. Sprague.

Resolved, That there be paid to Volney A. Sprague, out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of eighteen dollars and forty cents, to make his compensation as a temporary clerk in the office of the secretary of state, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-three, what he was entitled to receive by law.
