as above mentioned, the said Clark be fully indemnified by the State of Maine, from all liability he may incur or to which he may be subjected by reason of the delivery of said deed as above.

Снар. 385. Upon the delivory of said deed said Clark to be indomnified, &c.

Resolved. That upon the delivery of the said deed as mentioned in the foregoing resolve, the land agent is hereby required to cancel said deed, and also to deliver to Samuel S. Thompson, of Bangor, six notes by him given to the treasurer of the State of Maine, each for twenty-one hundred two dollars sixty-four cents and interest, and dated March twenty-four, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, which notes are now in the land office.

Land agent required to cancel said deed.

-to deliver to Samuel S. Thompson certain notes.

Resolved, That upon delivery of said deed as aforesaid, to the land agent, there be paid to Dudley C. Hall and Samuel F. Hersey, from any money not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-three hundred and twenty-six and fifty one hundredths dollars, the same being the amount which came into the hands of Isaac R. Clark, late land agent, from the said Hall and Hersey, and credited by the said Clark to the state as on account of the assumed conveyance aforesaid, of January nineteenth, eighteen hundred fifty-six.

Certain amount to be paid to Hersey & Hall, upon delivery of said deed.

Resolved, That if the said Clark shall refuse to deliver said deed as mentioned in the first resolve, the attorney general be directed forthwith to commence and prosecute such legal proceedings as he may deem proper to prevent the delivery of the same to Messrs. Hall and Hersey, and to restrain them or any other person from setting up any title against the state under such assumed conveyance.

Instructions to attorney general, if said Clark refuse to deliver said deed.

Chapter 385.

Resolve in aid of roads and bridges in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to expend the certain roads sums hereinafter named, for repairing roads and bridges in the county of Aroostook.

For repairing road leading from number eleven, range five, to Fort Fairfield, the sum of seven hundred dollars.

For repairing road leading from letter H, range two, to the St. John river, the sum of seven hundred dollars.

For repairing bridge over the Mattawamkeag river in number six, range five, the sum of five hundred dollars.

No. 11, R. 5, to Fort Fairfield, \$700.

Letter H, R. 2, to St. John river, \$700.

Bridge over Mattawamkeag. river, in No. 6, R. 5, \$500.

Through No. 9, R. 6, and No. 9, R. 5, \$209.

No. 11, R. 5, to Fort Kent, \$700

Military road and bridges on some, \$1,500.

Bridge over little Madawaska stream, in letter 1, R. 9, \$200. Month of the Allegash to terminus of the ast Aroostook Yoad, \$700. For repairing road through number nine, range six, and number nine, range five, as laid out by David Haynes, the sum of two hundred dollars.

For repairing road leading from number eleven range five, to Fort Kent, the sum of seven hundred dollars.

For repairing the military road, and the bridges on the same, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars.

For building bridge over the little Madawaska stream, in letter I, range two, the sum of two hundred dollars.

For repairing road from the mouth of the 'Allegash to the terminus of the east Aroostook road, the sum of seven hundred dollars.

Chapter 386.

Resolve in favor of Simeon S. Hasty.

Simeon S. Hasty, in faver of. Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury to Simcon S. Hasty, the sum of seven dollars, to defray the expense of sickness, while a member of the legislature.

Chapter 387.

Resolve in favor of William H. Lunt and another.

William II, Lant and Thomas Marr, Jr., in favor of. Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to William H. Lunt twenty dollars, and to Thomas Marr, junior, twenty-two dollars; it being for expenses incurred by them on account of sickness, while attending as members of the house of representatives, during the present session.

Chapter 358.

Resolves relating to the extension of slavery, the territory of Kansas, and secret political associations.

Extension of al every over the territories of the United States, Resolved, That in the judgment of this legislature the settled convictions of the people of Maine, are adverse to the extension of slavery over the territories of the United States;
