CHAP. 28.
—distribution of.

thereof being for the use of the legislature, and the remainder for distribution, under the direction of the board, among the people of the state.

Salaries and expenses.

SECT. 6. The governor shall, from time to time, draw his warrant on the treasurer for such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the salaries and expenses provided for by this act, an account thereof having been first rendered by the secretary of the board, and audited by the executive council; and a sum not exceeding one thousand seven hundred dollars annually, is hereby appropriated to meet such expenses.

Acts repealed.

SECT. 7. All acts and parts of acts, inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

SECT. 8. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 28.

An act to repeal an act entitled “an act in relation to directors of corporations.”

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Act of Feb. 27, 1857, relative to directors of corporations, repealed.

SECT. 1. An act entitled “an act in relation to directors of corporations,” approved February twenty-seventh, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 29.

An act to establish a standard weight for the sale of grain and carrots.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Grain and carrots, standard weight of, established.

SECT. 1. The standard weight of a bushel of wheat, shall be sixty pounds; of corn and rye, fifty-six pounds; of barley and buckwheat, forty-eight pounds; of carrots, fifty pounds; and of oats, thirty pounds.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
