SECT. 13. An act additional in relation to banks and banking, approved the tenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, is hereby repealed, saving all actions and causes of action which have accrued under said act; and it is continued in force for the purpose of collecting all forfeitures incurred under said act until final judgment in all cases which have been, or may be, commenced for any such forfeiture, and not otherwise.

SECT. 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 33.

An act additional respecting judicial proceedings.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The act to which this is additional, approved February twenty-seven, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, is amended so as to read as follows: "In all transitory actions between parties residing at the commencement thereof in different counties in this state, except in cases of foreign attachment, when the party plaintiff or the party defendant shall, during the pending of such action, remove into the county where the other party resides, such action shall, if in the judgment of the court the purposes of justice will be subserved thereby, and both parties at the time of making such motion continue to reside in the same county, on motion of either party, be transferred to the last named county, there to be heard and tried as if originally commenced and entered in said county.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
