PUBLIC LAWS

Chapter 36.

An act to exempt libraries from attachment and execution.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In addition to the goods and property now exempted by law from Libraries exempt attachment and execution, a library, not exceeding in value one and execution. hundred and fifty dollars, shall be exempt therefrom.

Chapter 37.

An act additional concerning the powers of judges of probate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The judge of probate having jurisdiction, may license and em-power executors, administrators or guardians, when it appears to certain cases. him to be for the advantage of the parties interested, to sell and convey pews, or interests in pews, in a meeting-house belonging to the estate under their charge, in the same manner that he may authorize the sale of goods and chattels.

Chapter 38.

An act additional to chapter sixty-seven of the revised statutes, relating to timber upon rivers and streams.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

If any person shall willfully and fraudulently take, carry away, Penalty for or otherwise convert to his own use, without the consent of the timber, &c., owner, any railroad sleeper, any knee, or other description of ship of owner. timber, any cedar for shingles, or for other purposes, being the property of another, whether the owner thereof be known or unknown, lying or being in any river, pond, bay, stream or inlet, or on or near the bank or shore thereof, within this state, or shall cut out, alter, or destroy any mark made on any such railroad sleeper, marks, &o. knee, or other description of ship timber, or cedar, he shall forfeit and pay for each and every such sleeper, knee or other description
