Chapter 11.

An act to extend the time allowed the Atlantic Bank to close its concerns,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

A further time of one year from the fourth day of March, one Time extended thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby allowed the Atlantic Bank, (which was chartered August twenty-eighth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty,) for the purpose of closing the concerns of said bank, in the manner provided in the act accepting the surrender of its charter, approved March fifth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five; and this act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved February 28, 1857.]

Chapter 12.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In order to provide for several acts and resolves of the legislature, Appropriations, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury; and the governor, with advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.

\$30,000 00 Public debt, thirty thousand dollars, Interest on public debt, thirty-eight thousand six hun-38,600 00 dred dollars, School fund, No. 24, seventy-five thousand dollars, 75,000 00 Interest on permanent school fund, eight thousand one 8,180 79 hundred eighty dollars seventy-nine cents,
