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**Chapter 30.**

An act in addition to an act to incorporate the Franklin Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The Franklin Company is hereby authorized to erect and maintain dams, locks, canals, mills, machinery and buildings, on their own lands, and to purchase and hold dams, locks, canals, mills, machinery and buildings, heretofore built and constructed on lands in the towns of Lewiston, Auburn and Danville, and to manufacture flax, hemp, cotton, wool, iron, steel, paper and wood, or any of them, in any of said towns, subject to the general laws of the state.

Authorized to erect and maintain dams, &c.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval.

**Chapter 31.**

An act to set off a part of the homestead of Horace Mixer from Sedgwick, and annex the same to Penobscot.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. All that part of Horace Mixer's farm now lying in Sedgwick, and south-west of the county road leading through Penobscot and Sedgwick, and north-west of the homestead of Daniel M. Gray, is hereby set off from Sedgwick, and annexed to the town of Penobscot; the inhabitants of Sedgwick to support the southerly half of said road, lying in front of said land set off, and the inhabitants of Penobscot to support the northerly half thereof.

Certain lands set off from Sedgwick and annexed to Penobscot. Boundaries.

SECT. 2. The sum of one hundred and seventy dollars is hereby deducted from the state valuation of Sedgwick, and added to the state valuation of Penobscot.

Valuation.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
