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## CHAP. 44.

## Chapter 44.

An act to incorporate the Cumberland Oil Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Eliphalet Clark, William Oxnard, Warren Sparrow, Charles E. Beckett, Frederick Oxnard and Oliver B. Dorrance, their associates and successors, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Cumberland Oil Manufacturing Company, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations; and said corporation is authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding in value, at any one time, fifty thousand dollars; and the same may improve, lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do; and said company is authorized to carry on at any one place near the tide waters of Portland harbor, either in the city of Portland, or towns of Westbrook or Cape Elizabeth, in the county of Cumberland, not interfering with the rights of others, the manufacture of oils and other like materials, and may purchase, erect and construct such machinery, mills, and other buildings, as may be useful for that purpose.

Corporate name.

Powers, privileges, &c.

May hold real and personal estate not exceeding in value \$50,000.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

## Chapter 45.

An act additional relating to the Maine Charitable Mechanic Association.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Limit of charter repealed.

SECT. 1. All the provisions in the several acts relating to the Maine Charitable Mechanic Association, by which the charter of the same is limited to a term of twenty years, are hereby repealed; and the said association shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, subject to the general laws of this state.

May hold real and personal estate not exceeding \$75,000.

SECT. 2. The said association may take and hold real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding seventy-five thousand dollars.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
