Chapter 93.

An act to incorporate the Messalonskee Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECT. 1. Samuel Appleton, David Hall, George Warren and Charles W. Dennison, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated by the name of the Messalonskee Manufacturing Company, with the powers and privileges, and subject to the duties and liabilities, incident to manufacturing corporations.
- SECT. 2. The corporation is authorized to carry on, in the town of Waterville, the manufacture of paper from cedar bark and any other materials; and may hold and manage estates, real and personal, not exceeding in value one hundred thousand dollars at any one time.
- SECT. 3. It may also manufacture any articles of wood, or metals, unless such manufacture is forbidden by the laws of the state.
- SECT. 4. Either of said corporators may call the first meeting of the corporation, by giving to the others seven days notice in writing.
- SECT. 5. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 94.

An act additional to an act entitled an act for the preservation of moose and deer, approved March twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven [three.]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECT. 1. No person shall hunt or kill any moose or deer on Long Island, in the town of Bluehill, in the county of Hancock, except he be a resident on said island.
- SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act, shall be liable to the same penalties, and be prosecuted in the same manner as is provided in the act to which this is additional.
