Chapter 1.

Resolve providing for state paper.

Resolved, That the "Kennebec Journal," a newspaper printed at Augusta, be, and the same is hereby declared to be the "state paper" of this state, in which shall be published all laws and resolves of a public nature; and also all advertisements, notices and orders, required by law to be published in the state paper. State paper.

Resolved, That all resolves, or parts of resolves, inconsistent herewith, be, and the same are hereby repealed; *provided*, that "The Age" shall be continued the state paper so long as may be necessary to complete the publication of any order or notice already inserted in said paper, and for no other purpose. Inconsistent resolves, repealed. Proviso.

Resolved, That these resolves shall take effect from and after their approval by the governor.

Chapter 2.

Resolve in favor of Socabason Swasson.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Socabason Swasson, delegate from the Penobscot tribe of Indians, the sum of thirty-five dollars, as a compensation for traveling expenses, and services, while attending this legislature. Socabason Swasson, in favor of.
