CHAP. 3.**Chapter 3.**

Resolve in favor of John Gabriel.

John Gabriel, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to John Gabriel, delegate of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, the sum of eighty-five dollars, as a gratuity for his expenses in attending the present session of the legislature.

[Approved January 26, 1857.]

Chapter 4.

Resolve in favor of Peol Sockes.

Peol Sockes, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to Peol Sockes, the sum of seventy-five dollars, as compensation for attending the present session of the legislature, as delegate of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

[Approved February 3, 1857.]

Chapter 5.

Resolve in favor of Sabattis Lewy.

Sabattis Lewy, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Sabattis Lewy, one of the Passamaquoddy Indians, the sum of thirty-five dollars, as a gratuity.

[Approved February 3, 1857.]

Chapter 6.

Resolve for the allowance of money paid to the state.

Land agent directed to make indorsements on notes in his office.

Resolved, That the land agent be directed to indorse on the notes now in the land office, given for township number eight, in the eighth range, west from the east line of the state, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars; said indorsement to be made under date of October twentieth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to be full satisfaction for that sum received by the land agent, and belonging to the purchaser of said township.
