CHAP. 89.

Chapter 89.

Resolve relating to the publication of the laws.

Publication of

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to audit and pay such sums as may be due to the publishers of newspapers in this state, for annually publishing the laws and such public advertisements as may be inserted in them by direction of the legislature.

Chapter 90.

Resolve concerning the special laws and resolves.

Special laws and
resolves, digest
of, commissioner,

Resolved, That there be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, a commissioner, whose duty it shall be to examine the special acts and resolves of this state, and prepare a digest thereof, with suitable indices, agreeably to the recommendation contained in the report of the commissioner appointed under the "resolves concerning the special acts and resolves of this state," approved March sixteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, and report to the next legislature.

Chapter 91.

Resolve in favor of the commissioners at Washington.

Commissioner at
Washington,

council to audit
and settle
accounts of.

Resolved, That the governor and council are authorized to audit and settle the account of commissioners at Washington appointed under a resolve of the legislature approved March seventeen, eighteen hundred fifty-five, at a compensation not exceeding eight dollars a day and necessary traveling expenses; but this resolve shall not authorize the governor and council to pay more than one commissioner for services at the same time; and said commissioner shall be charged with the prosecution of all the claims of this state against the United States.
