Chapter 94.

Resolve for payment of additional roll of accounts number thirty-seven.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations, respectively named in the additional roll of accounts numbered thirty-seven, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of twenty-one thousand eight hundred forty dollars fifty-nine cents, in full discharge of the claims and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 95.

Resolve in favor of Eliphas Gullifer and Orlando W. Gilman.

Resolved, That the land agent is authorized to grant permission to Eliphas Gullifer and Orlando W. Gilman to cut and haul, from the south-west quarter of township number six, in the fourth range, west from the east line of the state, twelve hundred thousand feet of spruce timber, to be taken off within four years from the passage of this resolve; and the foregoing amount of timber is to include the amount of timber hereafter cut, by virtue of a permit from the land agent of Massachusetts to the said Eliphas Gullifer and Orlando W. Gilman, dated August sixteen, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.
