CHAP. 96.**Chapter 96.**

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Cole, Jr.

Benj. Cole, Jr.,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of state, to Benjamin Cole, Jr., ten dollars, being his equitable proportion of the school fund of the state, for the past ten years; and which has been expended by him in the education of his children, on Calf Island, in the county of Hancock.

Chapter 97.

Resolve in favor of F. H. Fassett.

F. H. Fassett,
governor and
council to settle
accounts of.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to audit and settle the account of F. H. Fassett, for design and patterns for the King monument.

[Approved April 15, 1857.]

Chapter 98.

Resolve in favor of James Campbell.

James Campbell,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to James Campbell, a member of the house of representatives, the sum of twenty-five dollars, for the expenses of his sickness, during the present session; and the governor is authorized to draw his warrant therefor.

Chapter 99.

Resolve making an appropriation for repairing gun house, at Brewer.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be paid from the treasury of the state, for making repairs on the gun house, situated at Brewer; and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant therefor.
