Chapter 100.

Снар. 100.

Foreign paupers,

Resolve relating to foreign paupers and oriminals.

Resolved. That our senators in congress be directed, and our representatives requested to urge upon the consideration of congress into this country. the necessity of passing a law, imposing severe penalties against the introduction or importation into this country of foreign paupers and foreign criminals; since the introduction of such persons imposes unreasonable taxes upon our citizens, corrupts the public morals, and endangers the public safety.

Resolved, That the governor be, and hereby is requested, to forward a copy of these resolves to each of our members of Congress.

Chapter 101.

Resolve providing for the collection of statistics in relation to the colleges and other institutions of learning, in this state.

Resolved, That the superintendent of common schools be directed to collect, and submit in tabular form, in his next annual report, statistics in reference to the colleges and other institutions of learning, incorporated in this state; the statistics to embrace the following particulars, relating to each institution; where located, when incorporated, how much land and how much money received from this state or from Massachusetts, and the average number of pupils attending each during the last year.

Chapter 102.

Resolve ropealing a resolve approved March twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred and fiftysix, relating to books for the several towns and cities.

Resolved, That the resolve requiring the secretary of state to Resolve repealed. forward to the clerks of courts of the several counties all books and public documents belonging to the different cities, towns and plantations in said counties, approved March twenty-five, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
