Chapter 105.

Resolve in aid of roads and bridges in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to expend the sums hereinafter named, for making and repairing roads and bridges in the county of Aroostook ;

Certain roads and bridges, in aid of.

For making and repairing road leading from number eleven, range five, to Fort Fairfield, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars ;

For making and repairing the road leading from Presque Isle to the Saint John river, near Violette brook, the sum of five hundred dollars ;

For making and repairing the road leading from the boundary line, along the south side of the Saint John, to the Allagash river, the sum of one thousand dollars ;

Provided, That before any part of this last named sum shall be expended, a like sum shall be raised and expended on said road, by plantations of Van Buren, Madawaska and Hancock.

Proviso.

Chapter 106.

Resolve relating to the claims of the French settlers, under the treaty of Washington.

Resolved, That our senators and representatives in congress be requested to urge upon the general government the early recognition and settlement of the claims of the French settlers, arising under the treaty of Washington.

Chapter 107.

Resolve in relation to pension of Peter S. Folsom.

Resolved, That the pension now allowed to Peter S. Folsom be discontinued after the expiration of the present quarter.
