#### Chapter 113.

Resolve in favor of the temporary clerks employed in the office of the secretary of state.

Clerks in secretary's office, in favor of. Resolved, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the several temporary clerks employed in the office of the secretary of state, during the session of the present legislature, the sum of two dollars per day, Sundays included, and travel, from the day they entered said office, until formally discharged by the secretary of state.

### Chapter 114.

Resolve in relation to printing certain documents.

Stookholders, printing list of regulated. Resolved, That hereafter three hundred and fifty copies of the list of stockholders in banks and other corporations, shall be printed for the use of the legislature, instead of fifteen hundred copies as required by the resolve approved March sixteen, eighteen hundred fifty-five.

### Chapter 115.

Resolve in favor of Richard Wells.

Richard Wells, in favor of. Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury the sum of fifteen dollars to Richard Wells, a member of the House of Representatives, to defray the expenses of his sickness during the session.

#### Chapter 116.

Resolve in faver of Joseph Baker.

Joseph Baker, in

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to audit the claims of Joseph Baker, for services in the revision of the statutes, as clerk of the revision committee, and allow him a reasonable compensation therefor, and draw their warrant on the treasury for the same, from any money not otherwise appropriated.
