county of Lincoln, instead of the third Tuesday of May as is now provided by law.

CHAP. 4.

SECT. 2. All matters and things pending in or returnable to said court, and which would but for the provisions of this act, have day at the term of said court to be held on the third Tuesday of May of the present year as by law provided shall be returnable to and have day at the term of said court to be held on the first Tuesday of May of the current year.

Matter pending, when returnable and to have day.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved February 17, 1858.]

#### Chapter 4.

An act additional to chapter seventy-seven of the revised statutes relating to the supreme judicial court.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* as follows :

The supreme judicial court shall not sit on Christmas day; and when the time fixed by law for beginning and holding any term of said court shall be on that day, or on the fourth of July, or on the day designated for the choice of electors of president and vice president of the United States, said court shall stand adjourned until the day following, which shall for the entry of actions and other purposes, be deemed the first day of said term.

#### Chapter 5.

An act to define intelligibly the northern registry district of Aroostook county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* as follows :

Section nine of chapter seven of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by substituting the word south-east for the word "north-east" in the second line, so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

Northern registry district of Aroostook co. defined.
