CHAP. 11. ter is amended by striking out the word "two" so that the firstclause of said section as amended will read as follows:

> "The copy of the notice of sale and the certificate thereon deposited with the town clerk as required in section one hundred and fifty."

> SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 11.

An act for the preservation of certain useful birds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Birds not to be taken or killed at certain seasons.

SECT. 1. If any person shall between the first day of March and the first day of July, take, kill, or destroy any of the birds, called larks, robins, partridges, woodpeckers, or sparrows, or shall, within the time aforesaid, sell, buy or have in his possession any of the aforesaid birds, taken or killed as aforesaid, he shall forfeit for every such bird the sum of one dollar, to be recovered by complaint before any justice of the peace, one half for the complainant, and the other to the use of the town where the offence is committed.

Penalty.

-not to be killed on lands of another.

If any person shall shoot at or kill any of the birds mentioned in the preceding section, upon lands not owned or occupied by himself and without license from the owner or occupant thereof, at any time between the first day of March and the first day of September, he shall forfeit and pay to the occupant or owner of such lands the sum of ten dollars in addition to the actual damages sustained, to be recovered by such owner or occupant in an action of trespass.

Chapter 12.

An act additional to chapter thirty-nine of the revised statutes relating to the inspection of lime.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Lime not to be sold or shipped without inspection.

SECT. 1. Hereafter no lime manufactured in this state, shall be sold, exposed for sale, or shipped on board any vessel in casks,

except such as shall have been inspected, and branded, as hereinafter provided.

SECT. 2. All well burned, pure fine grained lime, of a white or First quality, yellowish color, hereafter manufactured in this state, for the purpose of being shipped or sold, shall be contained in casks well filled and in addition to the brands now required by law have the figure "1" and the word "quality" branded in a legible manner, upon each cask thereof.

All black, dark, impure lime hereafter manufactured Second quality. SECT. 3. in this state, for the purpose of being shipped or sold shall be contained in casks well filled and branded with the figure "2" and the word "quality" in a legible manner upon each cask put up.

SECT. 4. Nothing in this act shall be construed in such a man- Lump lime, ner as to interfere with the right of any party, to put up and brand specting. lump lime, in the manner now practiced, provided, such lime is included in that described in section second of this act.

The penalties, and mode of recovering said penalties, Penalties and as described in sections four and six of chapter thirty-nine of the ering. revised statutes, shall apply to the provisions of this act.

Chapter 13.

An act to amend section fifteenth of chapter fifth of the revised statutes, relating to lands reserved for public uses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The word "annual" in the first line of the fifteenth section of the Ch. 5, sect. 15, fifth chapter of the revised statutes is hereby stricken out.
