## CHAP. 131.

## Chapter 131.

An act to incorporate the Preachers' Aid Society of the Maine Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Corporators.

Corporate name.  
Powers.

May hold real and personal estate not exceeding \$15,000.

SECT. 1. William F. Farrington, Eaton Shaw, Henry Cox, John C. Perry, S. H. Hyde, D. B. Randall, William H. Strout, Parker Jaques, Joseph Colby, Asahel Moore, John Allen, John Young, their associates and successors, are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the Preachers' Aid Society of the Maine Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with all the powers incident to corporations under the general laws of the state; and may hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars, for the purpose of aiding needy preachers belonging to said conference, and their families.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

## Chapter 132.

An act relating to the city of Bath.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding \$100,000.

SECT. 1. The city of Bath is hereby authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, for municipal and public uses; any law heretofore made to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
