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**Chapter 133.**

An act to incorporate the Portland School for Medical Instruction.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. John T. Gilman, William Wood, Charles W. Thomas, Gilman Daveis, William C. Robinson and Israel T. Dana, their associates and successors are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Portland School for Medical Instruction, to be established in the city of Portland, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities set forth in chapter forty-six of the revised statutes.

Corporators.

Corporate name.  
Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

May hold real and personal estate not exceeding \$20,000.

SECT. 3. Any one of the persons named in this act, may call the first meeting of said corporation at such time and place as he shall designate, by giving written notice thereof to each corporator seven days prior thereto.

First meeting, how called.

**Chapter 134.**

An act to amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Trustees of Oak Grove Academy in Falmouth," approved April fifteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The act to incorporate the Trustees of Oak Grove Academy in Falmouth, approved April fifteenth, eighteen hundred fifty-seven, is hereby amended in the first line of section one, by striking out the word "Edwin", and inserting in place thereof, the word Ervin; also in the same line by striking out the word "Rounds", and inserting the words Roundy, jr.

Act approved April 15, 1857, amended.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
