This act shall take effect and be in force from and CHAP. 141. after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 141.

An act respecting school district number four in Winthrop.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

School district number four in the town of Winthrop, may, at a legal district meeting, in the month of April annually, elect not less than three, nor more than seven school directors to remain in office one year, or until others are chosen in their stead, with power to fill any vacancies that may happen in their number, who shall be sworn to the faithful performance of the duties of their cancies. office; and said directors shall have all the rights and powers, and perform all the duties, now enjoyed and prescribed by law, to be performed by school agents and the superintending school committee of the town, in said district; and said directors shall have power, and it shall be their duty to determine the number of grades of schools, and the number of schools of each grade which shall be kept in said district; classify the scholars according to their attainments, and direct at which of the schools they shall be allowed to attend respectively; lay out and expend the school money apportioned by the town and assigned to said district, in the support of schools thus established; and said directors shall make report of their doings and of the state and progress of the schools in said dis- make report at trict at the annual meetings thereof.

The inhabitants of said district may adopt any suitable By-laws. by-laws and regulations not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state, for the regulation of the schools in said district.

This act shall not be binding upon said district, until Act, how asaccepted by them at a legal district meeting.
