Chapter 158.

Снар. 158.

An act to incorporate the First Universalist Church in Rockland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Elkanah Spear, John W. Hunt, John P. Wise, T. K. Corporators. Osgood, G. S. Wiggin, Timothy Williams, Sumner Whitney, G. J. Burns, William H. Titcomb, Samuel Tibbetts, Joseph Farwell, M. W. Farwell, John Spear, A. P. Waterman, Davis Tillson, Calvin Hall, Edwin P. Lovejoy, H. H Spear, Jonathan Spear, Moody E. Thurlow, W. H. Thorndike, David Robinson, John T. Berry, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated as a religious society and parish, under the name of the First Universalist Church in Rockland, and by this name may sue and be sued, adopt such a constitution and by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as they may deem expedient, and may take and hold any estate, real or personal, which they may now possess or may hereafter acquire by donation or otherwise, the annual income of which shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars, said income to be faithfully applied to promote the cause of religion; and the said parish hereby constituted, is invested with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.

Any two of said corporators are hereby authorized to First meeting, call the first meeting of the corporation, by posting up, in two or more public places in said city of Rockland, notices thereof, seven days at least before the time appointed for said meeting.

Chapter 159.

An act to incorporate the Southport Mutual Fishing Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Freeman Grover, William Decker, Daniel Cameron, Corporators. SECT. 1. William Pierce, John Maddocks, Daniel Cameron, 2d, Thomas Marr, jr., Cyrus McKown, James Orne, Isaac Brewer, Willard Lewis and Freeman Orne, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation, by the name of the Southport Mutual Fishing Corporate Insurance Company, to be established in the town of Southport, for the purpose of making insurance against maritime losses on fishing Purposes.
