## Chapter 162.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Appropriations.

SECT. 1. In order to provide for several acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury ; and the governor, with advice and consent of council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same :

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 163.

An act to incorporate the Ellsworth Gas Light Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. Arno Wiswell, Calvin G. Peck and Hamilton Joy, their associates and successors are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Ellsworth Gas Light Company, for the purpose of manufacturing and selling gas in the town of Ellsworth, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities by law incident to corporations of a similar nature.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may for the purpose aforesaid hold real estate, not exceeding in value the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, and the whole capital stock shall not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars.

SECT. 3. Said corporation with the consent of the selectmen of the town of Ellsworth, shall have the right to lay gas pipes in any of the streets, lanes and highways, in said town, and relay and repair the same, subject to such regulations as the health and safety of the citizens, and the security of public travel may require, and as may be prescribed by the selectmen aforesaid.

SECT. 4. Any manufacturing company having its place of business in said Ellsworth, may hold stock in said corporation not exceeding a sum the legal interest of which will pay for all gas consumed and used for the purpose of lighting the buildings of said companies.

Manufacturing oompanies may hold stock.
