CHAP. 171.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved March 2, 1858.]

Chapter 171.

An act to incorporate the town of Bridgewater.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Town of

incorporated.

Powers, privi-
leges, &c.

First meeting,
how called.

SECT. 1. The plantation of Bridgewater Academy Grant and the plantation of Portland Academy Grant in the county of Aroostook are hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Bridgewater, and the inhabitants of the said town are hereby vested with all the powers and privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties and liabilities of incorporated towns in this state.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within said county, is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual town meeting.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 172.

An act to make valid the doings of the First Congregational Parish of Monmouth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The doings of the First Congregational Parish in Monmouth in organizing said parish, in building their meeting-house, in selling and conveying the pews therein, and in electing the officers of the parish, are hereby confirmed and made valid to all intents and purposes, notwithstanding any informalities or defects, in their proceedings heretofore in the same.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.
