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**Chapter 180.**CHAP. 180.

An act to make valid the proceedings of the town of Franklin.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

The proceedings of the town of Franklin in the county of Hancock in determining the number and limits of the school districts therein, shall not be affected by reason of any omission of the records of the time when the same was done ; and all votes in any of its school districts now or hereafter passed, shall have the like force and validity as if the record of the assignment of such school districts was full and complete.

**Chapter 181.**

An act to empower the collector of Atkinson for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, to close collection of school district tax for district number five in Atkinson, same year.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The collector of taxes in and for the town of Atkinson, for the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-six, is fully authorized and empowered to collect any and all school district taxes legally assessed on the inhabitants of school district number five, in said Atkinson, not heretofore paid, abated or re-assessed, committed to him for collection by the assessors of said Atkinson, under date of October twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred and fifty six ; notwithstanding any defect or omission in the warrant of said assessors annexed to said district tax bills.

Town of Atkinson, collector of, authorized to collect certain taxes.

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to, or effect any action now pending.
