James W. Hutchinson, F. A. Chase and all other persons who may Chap. 185. hereafter become members of said company, are hereby incorporated and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Fayette Corporate Mutual Fire Insurance Company, with full power to insure any species of real or personal property against loss or damage by fire; surance. provided, that no policy shall be issued by said company until Proviso. application shall have been made for twenty thousand dollars.

The said corporators are hereby authorized and em- Rights, privipowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and subject to all the liabilities and the restrictions thereof.

Chapter 185.

An act to authorize the extension of Jack's Point Wharf in Newcastle.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

John Glidden, Samuel Averill, second, and others who are or may become owners of Jack's Point Wharf, so called, in Newcastle, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and extend said wharf in a southeasterly direction towards and into the channel of Damariscotta river to a line not exceeding twenty-five feet beyond the present limits of said wharf; provided, that nothing in this act Provisc. shall be so construed as to authorize the extending of said wharf either up or down the river beyond the present width of said wharf as now constructed.

Authorized to build and extend wharf.

Chapter 186.

An act to incorporate the Woodland Cemetery Company.
