### Chapter 126.

Resolve in favor of incorporated plantations.

*Resolved*, That the secretary of state be instructed to furnish to incorporated plantations all books and reports to which towns are entitled by law; *provided*, the same are in the state library.

### Chapter 127.

Resolve providing for the distribution of the annual report of the superintendent of common schools.

*Resolved*, That the superintendent of common schools be authorized and directed to distribute, through the members of the present legislature, one copy of the fourth annual report of the superintendent of common schools to each member of the superintending school committee, and clerk of the several cities, towns and organized plantations of the state.

### Chapter 128.

Resolve in favor of Henry Upton.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Henry Upton of Norway, eight dollars per month during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received to his health while in the service of the state, as a soldier in the Aroostook war, and that the pension of eight dollars per month commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight.
