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**Chapter 129.**

Resolve in favor of L. T. Boothby and Charles Turner.

L. T. Boothby

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the state treasury to L. T. Boothby the sum of twenty dollars; and to Charles Turner the sum of two dollars, being the amount due them for their services as messengers of the board of agriculture at its late session as per report of the committee of the board on pay roll.

**Chapter 130.**

Resolve in favor of Daniel Winslow.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the state treasury, from any money not otherwise appropriated, to Daniel Winslow, twenty dollars, it being the amount paid by him into the state treasury as fees for commission as general inspector of beef for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, and the governor is hereby authorized to draw a warrant for the same.

**Chapter 131.**

Resolve in favor of Samuel Clark.

Samuel Clark,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Samuel Clark, or assigns, lot number five, in township number eight, range five, in the county of Aroostook; *provided*, that said Clark shall pay the sum of sixty-seven dollars sixty-one cents in labor upon the roads in said township, under the direction of the land agent, and shall also perform all the settling duties required under existing laws.
