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**Chapter 132.****CHAP. 132.**

Resolve in favor of Sanford Noble.

*Resolved*, That there be paid to Sanford Noble, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred and thirty-two dollars and ninety-three cents; the said sum being in full for land to which said Noble was entitled under the treaty of Washington, and entered in the land office to his credit.

**Chapter 133.**

Resolve in relation to the distribution of a portion of the public lands belonging to the United States.

*Resolved*, That our senators and representatives in congress, be requested to use their efforts to procure a fair and equitable distribution of a portion of the public lands belonging to the United States, among the several states, for educational purposes.
