Chapter 171.**CHAP. 171.**

Resolve to promote the education of the Penobscot Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury under the direction of the governor and council to such persons as they may direct, two hundred and fifty dollars to be expended by the superintending school committee of the town of Oldtown, and one hundred dollars to be expended by the superintending school committee of Lincoln, for the purpose of maintaining among the Penobscot Indians a school or schools for their education. And said committee are required on or before the first day of January next, to make full return of their doings under this resolve to the secretary of state, to be laid before the next legislature, specifying the length of the schools, by whom kept, the average number in attendance, and such other facts as they may deem for the interest of education among said Indians, or which the governor and council may require.

Chapter 172.

Resolve relating to the compensation of the commissioner at Washington.

Resolved, That the governor, with advice of council be authorized to establish by commission or otherwise, the compensation of the commissioner at Washington appointed under resolve approved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, but no compensation shall be allowed the commissioner unless it be taken from allowances made by the general government on claims prosecuted by him; and all resolves inconsistent with this resolve are hereby repealed.

Chapter 173.

Resolve in favor of Orrin Currier.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Orrin Currier, eleven dollars it being in full for expenses incurred on account of sickness while attending as messenger to the senate, the present session.
