Chapter 195.

Resolve in favor of Rufus Dwinel.

Whereas, certain moneys have been paid to the land agent, purporting to have been paid for timber belonging to the state of Maine, which timber is claimed to belong to land owned by Rufus Dwinel.

Dufus Dwinel, in favor of. Resolved, That he said land agent is hereby authorized and requested to investigate the subject, and if found to belong to him said Dwinel, as claimed, that he said land agent by and with the advice and consent of the governor and council, be directed to pay him said Dwinel, such sum as may be so found, together with interest on the same from the time it was so received.
