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**Chapter 204.**

Resolve authorizing the secretary of state to keep a book containing accounts of state against parties.

*Resolved,* That the governor and council be authorized to direct the secretary of state to purchase a suitable set of books, to open and keep a general account current between the state and all parties, in such form as they may deem convenient and necessary.

**Chapter 205.**

Resolve for the enlargement of the state prison.

*Resolved,* That the sum of thirteen thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the enlargement of the state prison at Thomaston; the enlargement to be made after such plans and specifications as may be approved by the governor and council, and the money to be expended under their direction.

**Chapter 206.**

Resolve relating to temporary clerks in the office of the secretary of state.

*Resolved,* That the secretary of state is hereby instructed, until otherwise directed by the legislature, to pay for all engrossing or other writing which may be done in his office by temporary clerks, by the page if practicable, at the lowest rate at which good work can be procured; and where it is not practicable to get said work done by the page, to pay such temporary clerks a sum not exceeding two dollars a day for the time they are employed without any allowance for travel.
