

Chapter 265.

CHAP. 266.

An act giving the privilege of legitimacy to Charles A. French.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Charles A. French of Farmingdale, in the county of Kennebec and state of Maine, son of Edmund Sanborn, late of said Farmingdale, deceased, born out of wedlock, and until the passage of this act illegitimate, is hereby declared to be legitimate, and entitled to all the privileges and subject to all the liabilities of children born in wedlock.

Charles A. French declared legitimate. Privileges, &c

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 266.

An act to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Falmouth Mutual Fire Insurance Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section three of the act incorporating the Falmouth Mutual Fire Insurance Company, is hereby amended by adding, in the fifth line thereof, after the words "vote of the members," the word "present"; and all the former proceedings of said company under said third section are hereby legalized.

Act of incorporation amended.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 267.

An act to annex to the town of Bradley the gore lying south of the same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The gore or tract of land, surrounded by the town of Bradley, Clifton and Eddington, in the county of Penobscot, bounded north by Bradley, south-east by Clifton, and south-west by Eddington, is hereby annexed to, and made part of said town of Bradley.

Bradley, certain land annexed to.
