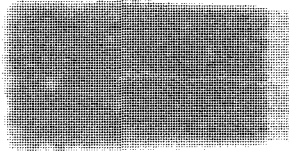

PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

Hodsdon, with the inhabitants thereon is hereby set off from the town of Columbia and annexed to the town of Centerville. CHAP. 280.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved February 24, 1859.]

Chapter 280.

An act giving additional power to the Lincoln Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Lincoln Mutual Fire Insurance Company are hereby authorized to insure against damage by lightning.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 281.

An act to define intelligibly the division line between the towns of Winthrop and Wayne.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The division line between the towns of Winthrop and Wayne, is hereby established as follows : beginning at a stone monument now standing on the line between said towns, at the north-west corner of said Winthrop, thence running south twenty-five degrees west, to a stone monument now standing where said division line crosses the Bishop road, so called ; thence the same course to a stone monument now standing where said division line crosses the road near Craig's bridge ; thence the same course to a stone monument now standing on the north line of land in possession of John Frost ; thence north sixty-five degrees west on said Frost's north line to a stone monument now standing in the road near Black's bridge ; thence on said last mentioned course to the stream leading into Wilson's pond ; thence southerly on said stream and the easterly shore of said pond to the north line of Monmouth.

Winthrop and Wayne, division line between, established.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
