

Chapter 284.

An act to empower the collector of Dexter to collect school district tax in district number nine, composed of parts of Dexter and Garland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The collector of taxes in and for the town of Dexter Collector of rized to collect for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight,

is fully authorized and empowered to collect any and all school dis- Chap. 285. trict taxes assessed on the inhabitants of school district number nine, composed of parts of Dexter and Garland, not heretofore paid or abated, and committed to him for collection by the assessors of said Dexter, under date of the thirtieth day of April, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, notwithstanding any defect or omission in any proceedings previous to said commitment.

- This act shall not apply to or effect any action now pending.
- SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 285.

An act to prevent the destruction of pickerel in the Purgatory ponds in the towns of Litchfield and Monmouth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. No person or persons shall take or destroy any pickerel Pickerel, takin the Purgatory ponds, so called, in the towns of Litchfield and ing of, prohib-Monmouth, their tributaries and outlets, until the expiration of five years from the passage of this act, when it may be lawful to take them with hook and line only.

Any person who shall at any time take or destroy any Violation. Sect. 2. pickerel in said waters, in violation of the provisions of the first section of this act, shall forfeit and pay a fine of five dollars for Penalty for. every fish so taken, to be recovered in an action of debt, one half _ how recovto the person suing therefor, and the other to the use of the town ered and disposed of. in which the offence is committed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
