

Chapter 292.

CHAP. 292.

An act explanatory of an act incorporating the town of Somerville.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Nothing in the act incorporating the town of Somerville, approved March twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight shall be construed to exonerate its inhabitants in their corporate capacity from liabilities, or deprive them of rights existing under and by virtue of their late corporate capacity of Patricktown plantation ; but they may settle and adjust the same, sue and be sued therefor, in the name of the inhabitants of Somerville.

SECT. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 293.

An act additional to "an act to incorporate the Lowell Bank."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The time for paying in the capital stock of the Lowell Bank at Lewiston, is hereby extended until the first day of October next.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 294.

An act to authorize Timothy Lane of Vinalhaven, in the county of Waldo, to erect a free bridge over tide waters from Lane's island to Vinalhaven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Timothy Lane of Vinalhaven, in the county of Waldo, or his assigns are hereby permitted to erect and maintain a free bridge over the tide waters from Lane's island so called, across a small branch of Indian creek so called to Vinalhaven ; said bridge shall be well built, of suitable width, and said Lane or his assigns shall keep a convenient draw of the width of twenty-eight feet for vessels
