PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

1859.

SECT. 3. The first meeting may be called by any three persons named in this act, by posting up in four public and conspicuous places in said Gray, notice of the time and place, at least ten days before such meeting, at which time and place, the members present may elect all needful officers, fix their compensation, and manage their own affairs in any way not repugnant to the general laws of this state relating to such companies.

CHAP. 330.

First meeting, how called.

Officers, election of, &c.

Chapter 330.

An act to make valid the doings at the annual town meeting in Peru.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The proceedings of the annual town meeting in the town of Peru, holden on the seventh day of March, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, are hereby declared valid, notwithstanding any omission in the posted copies of the warrant calling the same.

Certain doings in the town of Peru made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 331.

An act authorizing the inhabitants of the town of Ripley to purchase and hold certain real estate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of the town of Ripley in the county of Somerset, are hereby authorized at a legal meeting thereof, called for the purpose, by the votes of a majority of legal voters of said town present and voting, to accept, take and hold to their own use, a certain farm situated in said town, and conveyed to said inhabitants by one Simeon D. Bates, by his deed heretofore made and delivered to said inhabitants; and to raise a sum not exceeding four hundred dollars to pay for the same, to be assessed on the polls and estates of said inhabitants, and collected as other town taxes are.

Authorized to purchase certain real estate.

— may raise not exceeding \$400.

— how to be assessed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when it is approved by the governor.
