

Chapter 354.

Снар. 354.

An act to prevent the destruction of pickerel in the Garvin pond, and so much of the Great East pond and Horn pond as lies in the town of Acton and state of Maine-

Be it enacted by the Scnate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

If any person or persons from and after the passage of this act, at any time in the season of the year from the first day of December to the first day of April, shall in any manner take or destroy any pickerel in Garvin's pond and so much of the Great East pond and Horn pond as lies in the town of Acton and state of Maine, he or they, shall forfeit and pay a fine of five dollars for each pickerel so Penalty. taken or destroyed, and all fines arising from a violation of this act may be recovered by an action of debt in any court competent to try the same, one half thereof to the use of the person or persons who may sue for the same, the other half to the use of the town in which the offence is committed.

Chapter 355.

An act for furnishing pure fresh water at Getchell's corner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Samuel Gibson, William Belmore and A. J. Getchell, Corporators. Sect. 1. with their associates and successors, are incorporated into a body politic by the name of the Getchell's Corner Pure Water Association, with power to sue and be sued, to have a common seal and to change the same, and to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of this State.

Corporate Powers, &c: By-laws.

Said corporation shall have power to construct and May construct keep in repair an aqueduct by the side of the highway leading from the spring at the foot of the hill on the Pond road so called, and to carry said aqueduct to any part or point at said corner that the company may choose, and the said corporation may tax individuals - may tax for such reasonable sums for water furnished them at their dwellings by said company, as they may deem proper.

Said corporation may assess such sums of money on its May assess members, as will be necessary to carry out its purposes, with power to collect the same; provided, that the sums so assessed shall not Proviso. amount at any time to more than one thousand dollars.
