#### Chapter 229.

Resolve providing for the payment of roll of accounts number thirty-nine.

Payment of roll of accounts No.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated to the several persons, proprietors of newspapers, cities, towns and plantations respectively named in roll of accounts numbered thirty-nine, the sum set against the names of such persons, newspapers, cities, towns and plantations, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of four thousand two hundred and five dollars and seventy-four cents, in full discharge of all the claims to which they severally refer.

### Chapter 230.

Resolve in favor of Abigail Van Meter.

Abigail Van Meter, in favor of. Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Abigail Van Meter, wife of Oliver Van Meter of Deer Isle, or her assigns, all the right, title and interest, which the state has in and to lot numbered thirty-eight, in township number four, Indian purchase in the county of Penobscot, containing two hundred acres more or less; provided, that before such conveyance is made, a deed conveying the same to Phillis Rhode Island, dated March twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, shall first be returned to the land office and cancelled to the satisfaction of the land agent.
