Chapter 233.

Resolves in favor of the training and teaching indigent idiotic children.

Indigent idiotic children, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars, for the purpose of training and teaching such indigent idiotic children of the state of Maine, as may be considered proper subjects for education by the governor and council; *provided*, a suitable arrangement can be made at any New England institution established for the education and training of such children.

Resolved, That the governor and council be directed through themselves or some suitable commission, to make the condition and number of the idiots of our state a matter of investigation, and report to the next legislature the expediency of forming a state institution of our own.

Chapter 233.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Nicolar.

Joseph Nicolar, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury the sum of seventy-five dollars to Joseph Nicolar as payment for representing the Penobscot tribe of Indians at this legislature.

Chapter 234.

Resolve in favor of Passamaquoddy Indians.

Passamaquoddy Indians, in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty dollars be paid from the state treasury to the Indian agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe, to be expended for fencing purposes on the line of the Indian lands at

Nemcaas point in the county of Washington; said amount to be paid when said fence is completed. CHAP. 235.

Chapter 235.

Resolve in favor of Ebenezer Dunlap.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Ebenezer Dunlap of Topsham, six dollars per month during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received while in the service of the state, and that the pension of six dollars per month, instead of the sum now paid him, commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine. Ebenezer Dunlap, in favor of.

Chapter 236.

Resolve in favor of John Allen and J. Augustus Allen.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to John Allen, three lots of land adjoining the lot on which said Allen resides in township G, range two in the county of Aroostook; *provided*, that before any conveyance is made said Allen shall pay in cash for said lots at the rate of one dollar per acre. Also to convey to J. Augustus Allen lot number three in section number twenty-eight in said township G, range two; *provided*, that before the conveyance is made said Allen shall pay in cash for said lot at the rate of one dollar per acre. John and J. Augustus Allen, in favor of.

Chapter 237.

Resolve in favor of Justus Grey.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Justus Grey, lots numbered two and three in section thirty-four, lots numbered four and six in section thirty-three in township G, range two in the county of Aroostook; said lots containing three hundred fourteen four one-hundredth acres; in consideration of mills built Justus Grey, in favor of.
