Chapter 430.

CHAP. 430.

An act to amend an act to incorporate the Indigent Ministers' Relief Association, approved March fourth, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The act entitled an act to incorporate the Indigent Ministers' Relief Association, approved March fourth, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby amended by striking out in the first section of said act, the word "Indigent," so that said association shall hereafter be known by the corporate name of The Ministers' Relief Association.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

Chapter 431.

An act to incorporate the West Washington Agricultural Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. George A. Bucknam, J. D. Parker, George F. Talbot, Jotham Lippencott, Gowen Wilson, W. B. Smith and J. A. Milliken, together with such other persons as may join them, are hereby constituted an agricultural society to be known by the name of the West Washington Agricultural Society.

Corporators.

SECT. 2. Said society is hereby established within the towns of East Machias, Machias, Machiasport, Wesley, Northfield, Centerville and all the towns and plantations in said county lying west of said towns, and may take and hold property real and personal to an amount the annual income of which shall not exceed one thousand dollars to be applied to the advancement of agricultural and mechanic arts.

Corporate name.

Location.

May hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. Said society shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions usually granted to and imposed upon similar societies.

Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 4. The first meeting of said society shall be called by George A. Bucknam or either of the persons named in the first section, by publishing a notice thereof in the Machias Republican or Machias Union, three weeks successively, the last publication to be at least one week before the time of meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.
